Why I'm rare: My habitat is being converted to pine plantations for logging, and invasive plants are competing with me for space, light and water. It is difficult to survive in these new conditions.

My story: You can find me growing at six botanic gardens. These gardens are learning things about me (like how to germinate my seeds) that will help keep me from becoming extinct.

How you can help: Make sure plants you buy for your garden are not invasive, and replace invasive plants in your garden with native alternatives.
